

HIGHLIGHTS OF YEAR 3 (2012-2013)

- Appointment as a **member of the National Seniors Council**, for a two-year mandate.
- **Recipient of the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal** in recognition of the work accomplished for the well-being of Canadian seniors.
- **33 research projects in progress** (25 under the direction of the Chairholder and 8 under the direction of students).
- Among the 25 projects carried out by the Chairholder:
 - Five completed (three for the Chair's third year) that are still subject to knowledge transfer;
 - Five new grants;
 - Three research projects submitted to granting agencies for which a response is still pending (including two as Principal Investigator).
- **11 students** in a bachelor's, master's, doctoral program under the direction of the Chairholder (Five new ones and three who have completed their work this year) including one new FQRSC fellow student.
- **Being interviewed** on Radio-Canada's *Les années lumières*, a radio show regarded as a major hub for popular scientific information.
- **Ongoing enhancement of the website** (major interviews, scientific watch, current activities, regular news updates).
- Conducting **three other major interviews**.
- **37 publications and 57 communications**.
- Organizing **three scientific seminars** within the Chair.
- Organizing **four workshops** in national or international symposia.
- **Consolidating exchange missions with Respect-Seniors**, the Walloon Agency to Counter Elder Abuse, Belgium.
- Beginning of a more sustained collaboration with the Gerontology program at the University of Sao Paulo.
- Several projects carried out with colleagues from Laval University in countering financial exploitation.
- Invited as a **consultant in a financial exploitation case** (ongoing trial).
- **Several international collaborations**.
- **Great synergy of the Chair's work with other measures of the Governmental Action Plan to Counter Elder Abuse 2010-2015.**
