

## HIGHLIGHTS OF YEAR 5 (2010-2015)

### **Projects and grants**

44 research projects (27 in progress, 17 completed including 11 still in knowledge transfer)

- 16 funded projects by external organizations (SSHRC, SIRA/QADA, CIHR, New Horizons for Seniors, etc.)
- 11 pro bono projects
- 17 student projects

### **Students**

33 students hired in various projects

- 17 under the supervision of the Chairholder, including 8 completed projects

### **Training**

Developing a 45-hour course within the Master of Social Work program on mistreatment of older adults

Addition of blocks of hours in various programs

### **Knowledge transfer**

84 publications (averaging 17 per year), including two books (one in its 2<sup>nd</sup> re-printing)

- Diversity of selected mediums covering the spectrum of professional journals to the great international journals in the field including the *Journal of Elder Abuse and Neglect*

199 communications (averaging 40 per year) including 115 as guest speaker

- Diversity of audiences from seniors' associations to highly specialized international symposiums
- Priority given to invitations from Quebec
