Research

- 48 active research projects (31 on-going, 16 completed but findings not yet transferred and one completely finalized)
 - o Two new grants as principal researcher: QADA, Quebec-Wallonie-Brussels
 - O Three new grants as co-researcher
 - o Three pending funding requests submitted as co-researcher
 - Completion of a broad scale project concerning police intervention in cases of older adult mistreatment

Student Supervision and Training

- 10 students working on essays, dissertations or theses under the auspices of the Research Chair: 3 PhD candidates in gerontology (one grant recipient from FRQS *Quebec Research Grant* and one from SSHRC *Social Science and Humanities Research Council*) and seven in the social sciences master's program under the Chair (one recruitment in 2016)
- Three students amongst the ten completed their essays in 2016.
- Two other PhD gerontology students outside the Research Chair (one completed their studies this year)
- 37 hours of training and awareness-raising to a variety of interested parties, as well as the creation of training videos.

Knowledge Transfer

- 54 publications a record year
- Guest editor for special editions concerning the fight against older adults' mistreatment in two magazines: *Reflets* and *Vie et vieillissement*.
- Member of three organizing or scientific committees of symposiums with an international audience (REIACTIS - Network of International Studies on Aging, Citizenship and Socioeconomic Integration; CAG - Canadian Association of Gerontology; CIFGG - International Francophone Congress of Gerontology & Geriatrics)

Synergy with other PAM initiatives

- Completion of tasks by the Ministry of Public Security's working committee in relation to its commitments to PAM. In concrete terms, the Chair supplied a modified version of its reference guide for detection of abuse, developed in conjunction with the City of Montreal Police Department (SPVM) and including several elements of a provincial directive to all police services.
- Support for regional coordinators who are preparing to implement a socio-judicial agreement (three regional seminars in October and November 2016).
- Under the direction of two regional coordinators, revision of dozens of files and creation of a new file for the Reference Guide 2nd Edition.

- Participation in the committee on the terminology of mistreatment of older adults and comprised of helpline personnel and regional coordinators.
