

## Take action in countering mistreatment within a caregiving context

Participate to the development of the ARMCAR program

This project aims to offer an online multicomponent intervention program for informal caregivers and the organizations offering them support.

The program is entitled Acknowledging and Responding to Mistreatment in CARegiving (ARMCAR). It is about prevention and management of situations of mistreatment toward persons aged 50 years and older within a caregiving context.



Recruitment: September to November 2023

- Participants we are looking for:
  - employees, volunteers or their supervisors;
  - English or French speaking;
  - aged 18 years and older;
  - having at least 6 months of experience working within a non-profit organization, cooperative or social economy enterprise in home care whose mission is to offer direct services to informal caregivers in Quebec, with a portion of their clientele aged 50 years and older.
- Nature of the participation: An <u>online questionnaire (≈ 20 minutes)</u> and, if you wish to, an <u>individual interview</u> by videoconference or by phone (≈ 45 minutes).
- Objectives: To find out what your <u>organization's training needs</u> are in terms of managing situations of mistreatment toward persons aged 50 years and older within a caregiving context. This data will be used to develop the ARMCAR program.
